

What needs to be changed in the system to make it better?

Faculty

- The system needs to be more user friendly. Sending reminder emails to students was confusing. I was never sure if they truly went out.
- Explain how to use it better and make it available for a longer time.
- Focus on the structural aspects of teaching.
- Send regular reminders with SET links to the students many times before the deadline. **Students are reminded of unfinished evaluations each time they log into Canvas and some complained that they were being reminded too much. Those that have not completed their evaluation are reminded as well.**

Students

- I couldn't look at grades or assignments until I did the evaluation **per SET policy**
- Making it shorter
- Results need to be made transparent so students know the ratings of people who will be teaching them. **This function is already available to students [Faculty Evaluation Search](#).**

What did you like about the new system?

Faculty

- Program
 - I liked that it integrated into canvas.
 - I liked the dashboard
 - It was nice that I could see how many students completed the assessment.
- Convenience
 - It was much more efficient, and it was paperless.
 - No need for forms or asking a student to drop them off. Students could complete them on their own schedule
 - I do not wish to take up classroom time administering the survey. I can remind students to get it done and even allow extra credit to encourage participation and feedback.
- Easy to use
 - Did not take class time
 - Quick turnaround on feedback
 - I like not having to hand fill out all the forms with faculty id's, course number, etc. For team taught courses if you don't do that students don't always remember to write down who they are evaluating. It takes a lot of time to fill out all those forms.
 - I just added the link to Canvas & then pestered my students to take it

Faculty

- Timeframe is unfair, students should have until the end of the semester to complete it. **The evaluation timeframe is a SET policy and not set by the SET office.**
- Guest students could not fill out evaluations.
- Students do not want to take it which leads to selection bias in the responses and overall low response rates unless incentives are offered. **Please click [here](#) for ideas to increase your response rate.**
- The dashboard did not work. Everytime I clicked I got an error that said that the dashboards were down.
- I had to figure out where to find them. Also, for one of my courses the SET icon appeared on the dashboard, but not for the other...they did complete them though, so they must have gotten my reminder. However, one class had a low turnout rate and I completely missed the initial reminder. **This depended on faculty activating the link in Canvas. Canvas admin have assured us that it will be active by default in future semesters.**



Faculty

- I was prompted in canvas to check my response rate. Then I could see a table with each student's response status. Not exactly sure how the different options work in the emails--I could not modify the From/Reply To fields.
- I would review to determine the percent responding. If I did not feel there was sufficient participation, I reminded and encouraged the students to participate.
- I did not like this feature. It was not clear about when and if the message went out.
- I used it late, so I am not sure if it worked, but maybe it did because more students responded once someone in my Department open them again. It was confusing.





Longer	<p>Timing and grading were right timewise. Evaluation should be given additional time, I think.</p>	<p>I think it should be available longer. One week is not enough. I completely forgot about it and missed it. Two weeks would be better and more information on how it all works.</p> <p>The SET Policy has specific restrictions as to when SET can and cannot be administered. The policy is related to when grades are posted. This allows the evaluation to be unaffected by the final grade posted in class.</p>
Later	<p>Why do the SETs HAVE to be given when the semester is still going? Can it happen right after the semester officially ends? Therefore, we do not have to worry about not being able to access our grades or assignments (which did happen once). I had to fill out an evaluation before I could navigate my canvas web page.</p> <p>The SET Policy has specific restrictions as to when SET can and cannot be administered. The policy is related to when grades are posted. This allows the evaluation to be unaffected by the final grade posted in class.</p>	<p>As we approach the end of the semester, final assignments come due. Since some of these assignments are more "term" encompassing and may require more concentration, I feel that waiting until near the end of the semester allows the student to experience all expectations of the class and thus better evaluate the teacher.</p> <p>I had still not received any grades for one of my classes by the time I was being asked to fill the form. There was a large part of the form that I could not respond too because of this.</p>
Worked Well	<p>As I mentioned earlier, I experienced retaliation in one class, so regardless of the timing, no professor should have access to their evaluations until the semester is closed and grades are posted. Also, students should be assured that their comments will not be visible to the professor until the class has concluded in order to get the most accurate evaluation. Students will sometimes skew their answers to try to garner favor with the professor. The timing is probably good, but the evaluations should only be viewed by administrative staff prior to the close of the semester.</p> <p>The reports are not released until after grades have been reported and the evaluation period has closed. Therefore, avoiding any faculty reprisals</p>	<p>I do not know about the gradebook link. The evaluation timing was perfect in my opinion.</p>
Earlier	<p>At the end of the semester is more stressful b/c I am making sure all assignments are completed. It's hard to focus on the evaluation at that time.</p>	<p>Students often reflect what grade they think they will get when it is now close to the class end</p>



Gradebook link is a good idea.</p>	<p>For me the timing was just fine. The grade book link was ultimately not good because students who bypassed submitting the SET could not go back and do it later. We (me and my students) were frustrated about that because I offered bonus points to all completers...but this who bypassed before I had that set up we're at a disadvantage. 
What type of Online SET user are you?







Missing link in Canvas (this error has been fixed)	My only issue was that in my summer course, I was able to see a Canvas link to the SET whereas this semester I did not see the tab in Canvas. I couldn't figure out why that was, but I didn't worry too much about it because I did see that students were completing it (likely via the email invite they received).	Canvas links need to be fixed. They no longer work. They have worked in previous semesters. I also believe that controls need to be established to increase accurate evaluations from students.

Personalization	<p>None of my professors submitted their own questions.</p> <p>using boilerplate survey for every class is silly since some questions don't apply.</p>	<p>I missed how we can add questions. Knowing that for next semester work be great.</p> <p>In addition to the SET instrument questions, faculty can design and add up to ten supplemental questions that will support the learning goals for their course.</p> <p>Once questions have been created, they should be emailed to students before the evaluation period. Students should be advised to enter their responses in the 'Instructor Supplied Items' section of the evaluation.</p> <p>Moving forward we are looking to give faculty the option of creating their own questions within Blue.</p>
Reminders	<p>The instructor should receive some sort of notification to their email when reminders are sent to their students.</p>	
Reports	<p>I appreciate having an electronic record of comments. Very useful.</p> <p>My biggest hope for this system is that I will get my evaluations back faster. Getting scores back 3 to 4 months into the following semester is not that helpful. We need results quickly enough to make changes for the next semester if these are to be useful.</p> <p>Fall 2020 evaluations were released to faculty 1/13/21.</p>	<p>It worked well. Some of the categories could be combined. It would be helpful to know how these scores are used and who sees them.</p> <p>Do the student survey results get shown somewhere visible to future students?</p>
Response Rate	<p>Online SET gets lower response, which was why I would hesitate to use it when we are back to in person. However, its convenience is competitive.</p> <p>The main concern with an online-only SET system in our college is the low response rates. Without extra credit they are dismal, and this creates significant selection bias in a process that is already riddled with biases. An in-person class gets a much better response. I have been able to get response rates up to about 80% with extra credit however this is not possible in all classes. I don't know if the SET office can do anything about this, but it is a concern.</p> <p>Keep the evaluations coming, because plenty students filled them out. Stop! saying that you can opt out, it should be mandatory to evaluate your instructors.</p> <p>We do offer suggestions to increase response rates on our website here. Also, completing an evaluation is optional for students and not mandatory.</p>	
Evaluation		<p>Make the evaluations shorter</p>

Timing	<p>Send it later in the semester or provide a video overview for students (and instructors) about the timeframe</p> <p>Great system but it was the first time using it online, so I just have to get used to the new timeline.</p> <p>Please give students more time to fill out evaluations. At the end of the semester they are busy finishing up and don't have time, especially for team taught courses, to fill out 10+ long evaluations.</p>	<p>Once closed, IT should have the ability to reopen for at least 24 hours to get better participation.</p> <p>The end of the evaluations came too soon on 6 December 2020. I did not do the evaluations, because I still had questions about my professors and their performance.</p>
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Suggestions to Consider (SET Committee Members, please consider the items marked in Blue.)

1) Evaluation window should be after the semester ends.

Current policy forbids this because the idea is that quality of teaching should be measured, as distinct from what grade a student received. ***We can address this through education.***

2N SET committee can consider if they would like to change this.

2) Some students fear repercussions because the evaluation occurs before grades are posted.

Reports are not shared with faculty until after all grades are posted. Furthermore, identifiers are not included in any reporting. ***We can address this through education.***

2N SET Committee: We can limit reports further to protect anonymity when the number of students is fewer than three. We can also not collect the data for classes with enrollments under three. These policies are included because an instructor can identify the students when the sample size is so low.

However, we currently collect these because of requests from departments. Often, departments need the input on a professor. We currently evaluate classes in Blue when there are fewer than three students in a class, because of protests from departments. Should we readjust these back to better protect confidentiality?

3) Some faculty would like to see who has participated so they can selectively remind those students.

The system is set up to selectively remind students who have not participated, without sharing names with faculty. This is to protect anonymity of students.

4) Timing

Many faculty do not know that they can work with their SET coordinator to adjust the time when their evaluation is available. They should remember to do that early in the semester.

The 2N Committee can consider giving this privilege to faculty.

- We decided not to because there are a few faculty who intentionally try to reduce participation by giving them at a time which is intentionally bad.
- Another problem is that if we give this access to faculty to adjust directly, team taught courses can be confusing. Each team member can adjust the dates. One faculty member could choose a different date than the other. The person who changes the date last wins. We can ask the faculty to determine this among themselves. ***However, there are no protections for the other faculty in the case of a disagreement.***
- Currently, we have the SET coordinators do this as a neutral party. This is a lot of work for them. But a good thing about this is that the SET coordinators and Faculty are working together on the dates and looking into the details when the dates are widely wrong. This can reflect errors in Banner, that the SET coordinators can fix.

There are some faculty who would like us to exclude students who drop the class after census day. That is not currently possible with the program we are using. We are looking at updating to a special system that will help with this.

2N SET committee, if we can make this upgrade to exclude students who drop late, philosophically should we? Should students who have dropped a class be able to evaluate it? They can leave the item blank which asks them what grade they expect to earn. Many faculty believe that allowing these students to evaluate the course encourages them to complain without doing the work.

However, a faculty member whose students consistently drop in large numbers may have concerns that need addressing. The comments could help an instructor, but also can lower the instructors' averages.

5) Many faculty are not sure how to share their personal items to students.

They simply should distribute the items by email to the students prior to the evaluation. ***We can address this through education.***

6) Gradebook

Students need to know that they can opt-out, to view their grades without completing the evaluation. Some browsers may require that they close the program and restart it, so that the gradebook link goes away. ***We can address this through education.***

7) Evaluation window

Faculty do not seem to know how to view their evaluation window using the link to the online interface. It is not included in emails because it can vary depending on the last day of class. ***We can address this through education.***

8) When we are back in the classroom

Some faculty do not know that they have the option of using Online SET during a regular semester by contacting their SET coordinator. ***We can address this through education.***

9) Results sharing

Students are not aware of how results are shared transparently. ***We can address this through education.***

10) Input about policy

Policy was developed for paper-based SET. It can be reconsidered in this new format. We had to make quick decisions, but we can make changes, if the **2N SET Committee** would like us to.

Dear Laura:

I do not think SETs are worthwhile, as most research indicates that they are essentially popularity contests. Students are often poor evaluators of teaching.

I am against conducting SETs online: the result is that the SET administration is timed at the convenience of administrators and not according to the faculty member's understanding of their students and their class. This is another example of the corporatization of the university and control by bureaucrats of what should be faculty-controlled policies. Further, this online administration was supposed to be done only as an emergency measure because of the pandemic, yet most communications, such as yours, seem to assume that this is the "new" SET system, here to stay for good.

My concern is that others reading this report may not understand the teaching environment that is being evaluated. Perhaps describing the teaching environment as part of this report would make the report more useful to others.

I am teaching an asynchronous online course. All of the teaching materials are online. My only interactions with the students are:

- * when they email me with questions
- * when they are having trouble with the online lab exercises
- * when I provide feedback on assignments that they submit
- * when I post announcements in CANVAS

Consequently, I find some of the questions in the SET survey to be inappropriate to an asynchronous online course. For example:

- * rating instructor enthusiasm
- * rating individual rapport with students
- * rating how the instructor encourages differing views

I also do not understand how there are responses to instructor supplied items, when I did not provide any instructor supplied items.

Laura,

I have a concern regarding the SET evaluations for students to complete for courses at WSU. While I did complete the survey, these concerns did not surface until after the semester was finished and I had completed my own SET evals, but also other students had some of the same experiences.

Since you've requested feedback, I hope you'll consider this as additional info to consider.

1. SET evaluations locked students out of Canvas until the evaluations were complete during the week of finals and preparation for finals.
 - a. This is unrealistic timing for several reasons:
 - i. Evaluations should include feedback that includes the final for each course.
 - ii. The timing for this is not focused on the student experience, but rather making sure the student must complete it to take the final for completion analytics for WSU.
 - iii. Instructors and Professors should be subject to the full experience offered through their classes; which includes the final exam. Without it, the information for reviews of Professors available through the WSU site are skewed and incomplete and benefit the instructor or professor only.
 - b. Professors should not be able to access the comments and scores until AFTER the grades are submitted.
 - c. Students report having completed a non-complimentary evaluation of a professor or a course, and this is reflected in the grading of the final exam.
 - d. Students fear reporting a transparent and complete review due to the timing of the SET evaluations and requirement to complete the survey to take the final exam or access Canvas until it is complete.
2. Professors who require or make the evaluation part of their grade package for the course are pandering for better scores and outcomes for their overall average scores.
3. Average scores are skewed. If a Prof receives an overall average of 3.5, the reporting information shows the overall score as a 4. This is misleading for students to review a Prof's performance and student evaluations.
4. Professors should ***not*** be the only individual who has access to the comments on the SET evaluations.
 - d. Students have no recourse for retaliation by a Prof for a non-complimentary comment or response.
 - e. Comments should be made available to the position or person the Prof reports to for annual review of the course and outcomes from the student regarding their experience.

- Instructor supplied items
- Evaluations are anonymous
- Instructors do not receive any reports until after the start of the next semester
- Instructors may schedule class time for online evaluations if they are concerned about response rates
- Instructors are supplied with detailed instructions to pass along to students
- Instructors may ask departmental SET coordinators to adjust their evaluation periods
- Tips for increasing response rates are available <https://testing.wayne.edu/pdf/constructivecriticism.pdf>
- SET policy could be clearly spelled out for students: timing, grade book, opting out, department access
- Students receive email reminders and Canvas reminders when they have unfinished evaluations or evaluations not started.
- Students may opt-out if they wish, but this cannot be undone
- Students can search for instructor ratings on our website <https://testing.wayne.edu/evaluation/search>
- Provide confirmation to faculty when reminders are sent to their students.
- Provide system reminder dates to faculty so as not to overlap. (this may be difficult to do)
